A key focus of the training was the use of locally available and indigenous ingredients to encourage the development of unique, culturally rooted food products with commercial potential.

Food Product Development and Innovation

The RDTC organized a five-day hands-on training on Food Product Development and Innovation, conducted by two food experts from Kasetsart University, Thailand. The training aimed to strengthen the technical capacity of trainees, staff and aspiring entrepreneurs in developing new food products or improving existing ones. Participants gained valuable insights into the entire product development processfrom idea generation and formulation to processing techniques, packaging and sensory evaluation. The sessions emphasized the importance of aligning food innovation with consumer needs, market trends, nutritional value and food safety standards.

Food Product Packaging Training

A four-day Food Product Packaging Training was conducted by another two Thai experts from Kasetsart University, Thailand. The program focused on modern packaging techniques, food safety, shelf-life extension and eco-friendly solutions. Key materials covered included plastics, glass, metals and paper, addressing primary, secondary and tertiary levels of packaging. The training emphasized sustainable and practical innovations aimed at improving food quality, reducing waste and enhancing market competitiveness.
